Montana Code Annotated 2019 TITLE 45. CRIMES CHAPTER 8. OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER Part 1. Conduct Disruptive of Public Order

Disorderly Conduct

45-8-101. Disorderly conduct. (1) A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct if:

- (a) the person knowingly disturbs the peace by:
 - (i) quarreling, challenging to fight, or fighting;
 - (ii) making loud or unusual noises;
 - (iii) using threatening, profane, or abusive language;
 - (iv) rendering vehicular or pedestrian traffic impassable;
 - (v) rendering the free ingress or egress to public or private places impassable;
 - (vi) disturbing or disrupting any lawful assembly or public meeting;
 - (vii) transmitting a false report or warning of a fire or other catastrophe in a place where its occurrence would endanger human life;
 - (viii) creating a hazardous or physically offensive condition by any act that serves no legitimate purpose; or
 - (ix) transmitting a false report or warning of an impending explosion in a place where its occurrence would endanger human life; or
- (b) in the course of engaging in any of the conduct prohibited by subsections (1)(a)(i) through (1)(a)(vi), a peace officer recognizes the person's conduct creates an articulable public safety risk.
- (2) (a) Except as provided in subsections (2)(b), (3), and (4), a person convicted of the offense of disorderly conduct shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100.
 - (b) A person convicted of a second or subsequent violation of subsections (1)(a)(i) through (1)(a)(vi) within 1 year shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 10 days, or both.
- (3) A person convicted of a violation of subsections (1)(a)(vii) through (1)(a)(ix) shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 1 year, or both.
- (4) A person convicted of a violation of subsection (1)(b) shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 1 day, or both.

Consider Approval of change to Classified Pay Matrix

Facts and Discussion:

- 1. The Bozeman School District Long Range Strategic Plan (LRSP) includes Goal Area 2 which states that the District will hire, develop and retain highly qualified and effective personnel to meet program needs.
- 2. The District and Bozeman Classified Employees Association (B.C.E.A.) are partners to a Collective Bargaining Agreement that is extended to June 30, 2025. The District and B.C.E.A. negotiated salaries for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023 for Classified employees.
- 3. On September 27, 2021, the Board of Trustees approved mid-contract pay increases for B.C.E.A. food service and special education paraprofessionals to assist with recruiting and retaining those positions.
- 4. On November 8, 2021 the Board of Trustees approved \$1,000 Learning Loss Stipends for the District's Certified employees for both the 2021-22 and 2022-23 school years.
- 5. On December 13, 2022 the Board of Trustees approved mid-contract pay increases for Classified staff who did not receive increases earlier in the fall.
- 6. On June 13, 2022, the Board of Trustees approved mid-contract pay increases for staff that fell into the "D" column of the Classified pay matrix, as they had not received an adequate hourly increase based on the equation used to calculate the December 13, 2021 increases.
- 7. Administration discovered there is no increase listed in the "B" column between steps 3 and 4. Therefore, the matrix has been updated to reflect an adequate increase for step 4 employees. This, in turn, corrected all corresponding steps in the "B" column.
- 8. Administration reviewed the hiring challenges for the Food Service positions in the District. To better compete with other local restaurants and food service businesses, an increase to the base hourly wage of the Food Service matrix is recommended.

Fiscal Impact:

The estimated cost of the proposed increase is \$81,150 annually. This amount will be paid out of multiple funding sources, with the majority paid from the District's Food Service fund.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board approve the changes to the 2022-2023 Pay Matrices as presented.

1. Do not approve the recommendation and request administration propose changes.

- 5. The <u>2021-2022 LRSP Annual Report</u> was a "looking back" endeavor intended to capture District and site-specific LRSP implementation efforts over the past school year. The 2021-2022 LRSP Annual Report was approved by the Board of Trustees on July 11, 2022.
- 6. Bozeman Public Schools is focused on continuous improvement as clearly articulated in Student Success Policy #3610.
- 7. The following documents outline the 2022-2023 Long Range Strategic Plan that will guide and focus the efforts to ensure high levels of learning for all students.
